These proceeds will enable us to explore and/or move forward with a number of projects, including constructing an Event Stage at the Groves; adding more Sand Volleyball and Pickleball Courts; expanding the Skatepark (but also adding a Pump Track); creating more bridges and trails; planning for a Planetarium; and a number of other projects - both small and large!

I am often asked about my goals or vision as it relates to the new position. I have to say that it is hard to narrow it to just one or two; however, if I had to, it would be that my focus as we move into the future of the Park is on inclusiveness and customer service to ALL our residents and visitors.

Our 2 Dog Parks


Pelican Park Bark Park

Please make sure **TO READ ALL** of the posted rules before entering the dog parks. Owners are responsible for their dog's behavior.


Pretty Acres Dog Park in Covington

DAILY HOURS: 7 a.m. – 9 p.m.

Bikes are permitted at the skate park during the following times:

Tuesday & Thursday from 5 – 7 p.m.

Saturday from 7 – 9 a.m.

During these times, the skate park is for bikes only (no skateboards or scooters). Helmets, knee pads and elbow pads are strongly encouraged. Stay tuned for future plans for the skate park's growth!

Disc Golf


Sand Volleyball Courts

First Aid/ CPR Training



On January 2nd, 2023 Demar Hamlin, NFL safety for the Buffalo Bills, suffered a cardiovascular injury that almost cost him his life. However, many people do not realize the work of the Buffalo Bills Athletic Trainer Staff that saved Hamlin's life. Denny Kellington quickly recognized the situation and jumped immediately to perform CPR on Hamlin for over 7 minutes. He used the same CPR technique that is taught and certified to countless people. While 65% of people are knowledgeable in CPR, only 18% of people are currently certified in the technique. Pelican Park plans to change that number in hopes to save more people like Demar Hamlin.

Pelican Park will be offering American Red Cross Adult & Pediatric CPR/AED/First Aid to the public in order to provide the necessary skills and confidence to respond to medical emergencies. Recreation Superintendent Steven Knecht, who is a certified CPR/AED/First Aid instructor, will be leading the classes. Frequently Asked Questions

Can players request to be placed on a team with a friend or neighbor for carpooling?

No special requests such as these are honored for age groups 7 and above: however, we do honor these requests for ages 5 and 6 since they do not evaluate. Team distribution is made according to the ability of players to ensure that the teams are evenly distributed.

- Brothers/Sisters or step-brothers/sisters who are in the same age group can be placed on the same team.
- This request **MUST** be completed on the original registration form, prior to the end of registration. This process will be the ONLY WAY special requests will be honored. No requests will be taken after registration ends.

What night will the games be played?

Game and practice days and times are determined after registration is over and will depend on the number of teams per age group. 5's & 6's will be playing only on Saturday until the school session ends, at which time they will also begin playing on weekdays. Age groups 7 & up will play one weekday game and one weekend game throughout the season.

Can my child play up/down an age group?

Play ups are **ONLY** allowed for age groups that are not combined. To request that a child play up, the parent or guardian of that child MUST visit the office and fill out a play up form prior to the end of registration. Play downs are rarely granted and are for medical reasons only. Staff approval is required for any play down request. No play ups are allowed into the 5-year-old age group.

What are Scholarships?

Scholarships are offered to In-District residents. They can be a partial scholarship or a full, whichever fits your needs. Scholarships are to allow children whose family need financial assistance to be able to participate in our sports. To qualify for a scholarship, you will need to visit the front office and fill out the scholarship form. You will also need your driver's license and your approval letter from the state (ex. Food Stamps, Medicaid).

Concessions at the Park are now accepting **Credit Cards!!**

You can get all your favorite refreshments with just a simple Tap, Swipe, or Insert. We accept all Major Credit Cards (Visa, Mastercard, American Express, and Discover). Please be sure to visit one of our 12 Concessions and check out our New system Toast and use your Credit Card for easy pay.

Sheriff Detail:

Sheriff Detail may be found on premise during all Pelican Park Youth games and for most events on site. Sheriff Detail may be contacted through the St. Tammany Parish Sheriff's Office nonemergency number, the Facility Staff at (985) 966-6645 or 911 (emergency use only). While there is a detail on premise during these events, we ask that valuables not be left in your vehicles to prevent crimes from happening.

Lost & Found:

All Lost & Found items with the exception of items of high value (phones, jewelry, purses, wallets, etc.) may be found at the Brown Gym office. All high value items will be turned into the front office. Park staff collects items daily and brings them to the lost and found. Facility Staff will attempt to call the owners if a number is on the item for pickup. After an item is left in the lost & found for 30 days, they will be dropped off at a local donation site. For any questions on lost & found you may call the Pelican Park Front Office at (985) 626-7997.



Pelican Parks Water System

Did you know that Pelican Park has two water wells on our property and they supply water to the whole Park? There is a 10-horsepower submersible pump installed 180' deep with a 1,000 gallon above ground storage tank located at the Brown gym that generates 125 gallons of water per minute. This well supplies the Brown gym, Green Triplex, Pelicans Landing pavilion, and irrigation for the Green, Orange, and Gray fields and supplies over two million gallons of water per year just at

these facilities. There is also a 50-horsepower submersible installed 300' deep with a 12,000 gallon above ground storage tank located behind the Castine Center that generates 500 gallons of water per minute. This well supplies the Castine Center, Blue Baseball Complex, Red Softball Complex, as well as the Yellow, Purple, Gold, Silver complexes, the Skate / Dog Parks, and generates over 9 million gallons of water per year throughout the park. The park utilizes both hypochlorite (gas) and Sodium chloride (liquid) to treat and ensure that our drinking water is safe year-round for all of our patrons. Pelican

Park has two licensed Staff through the LRWA for overseeing both water and sewerage. Licensed attend annual training and conferences to stay up to date with all Federal and State regulations.

Pelican Park - A Great Past, An Amazing Future!

While much has changed about Recreation District #1's (RD#1) Pelican Park since it opened, one thing has remained constant over the years: a vision of, and a commitment to making a positive, significant difference in community life. Initially, the focus was on providing critically needed facilities and programs for youth sports. This focus was then expanded to include adult sports, and an expansive array of leisure and learning activities for all segments of a fast-growing population. These efforts have largely been successful and have brought us to where we are today. Pelican Park is widely recognized as an

outstanding regional facility for sports and other leisure activities.



As we have grown and learned, however, it has become apparent that we are no longer just a ballpark, not just a collection of athletic fields with gyms and an auditorium. Making a real difference in the future can mean much, much more than that. It will, of course, mean providing facilities for the increased demand for our existing services from a growing population. It will mean accommodating new, different sports and activities as they become popular, and it will also give RD#1 an opportunity to focus more on the "Parks" side of "Parks and Recreation."

This type of park is a magical place, a memory maker. It's a vast open space for picnics and concerts, throwing footballs or frisbees with the family, looking at the nighttime sky, walking or biking along trails shaded by trees, being closer to, and learning more about, nature. And they're only a few miles from your home, adventure islands seemingly light years away from the traffic and other annoyances of city life. They are fun places that you remember going to as a child for the rest of your life. This is what we see that our almost 500 acres at Pelican Park can become. We envision it becoming an amazing memory maker and a huge "difference in the lives of children and adults."

Also, a new St. Tammany Parish by-pass road will finally connect U.S. Highway 190 and Louisiana Highway 1088, thereby providing an additional ingress and egress for Pelican Park. This will provide much-needed access to the Park, but will also bisect it, creating both operational challenges and opportunities. Ultimately, however, it will allow many new roadway interconnections that provide more efficient access to and throughout the site.

The 2023 Master Plan effort aims to integrate and expand the Park's diverse offerings, capabilities, and opportunities into a cohesive framework for future development. The RD#1 aims to maximize the potential of Pelican Park to best serve all recreational needs of its constituents.

Environmental Education





Week 1 – Soil Detectives - (June 5-9th)

Come and get your hands dirty as we explore the plants, animals and fungi that live in our soil. Investigate soil samples, rocks and minerals that are found here and the rest of the United States.

Week 2 – Signs in Nature - (June 12-16th)

Become a nature detective by learning to identify signs found in nature such as animal skat, skins, prints, nests and sounds of native animals. Use your detective skills to track down animals that call Louisiana home.

Week 3 – The Bs of Nature - (June 19-23rd)

Learn about Louisiana wading birds and their habitats, bees and beehives, bugs and bats as we explore the "B"s of Louisiana.

Week 4 – Swamp Critters - (July 10-14th)

Learn about animals that call our marshes and swamps their home. Get close up and personal with alligators, crawfish, crabs, turtles and frogs living in Louisiana.

Week 5 – The Wonders of Water - (July 17-21st)

Connect with the nature found in our local waterbodies as we explore the plants, bugs, birds and fish found in ponds, rivers and lakes nearby. Investigate the awesome properties of water and where we get our drinking water from while learning how to protect this most valuable

Week 6 - Secret World of Plants - (July 24-28th)

Discover some of the special plants that are native to Louisiana. Learn about plants that host butterflies, invasive plants, carnivorous plants and plant adaptations that make it possible for so many plants to live in water. Learn how local animals use plants in their habitats.

Louisiana Iris Conservation Initiative (LICI) Update

Have you seen the Louisiana native irises blooming at Pelican Park? There have been about 1000 irises planted over the last year in Pelican Park by the Louisiana Iris Conservation Initiative (LICI). LICI is a Louisiana non-profit formed by individuals interested in preserving and restoring the Louisiana iris in habitats where it once grew in abundance. The group relocates wild, native irises threatened with destruction to area refuges and nature preserves, typically in locations where they can be viewed by the public when they bloom. Pelican Park is lucky enough to benefit by being one of their planting sites.

The weather pattern we had this Spring - extended hot periods and then cold periods - had the irises all confused but we ended up with a solid extended bloom instead of a mass peak bloom at Pelican Park.

"Thank You!" goes out to the volunteers that helped LICI get Louisiana irises planted at Pelican Park/Recreation District #1.
