Please Vote!

On April 27, 2024 St. Tammany Parish will hold an election, and Recreation District #1 (Pelican Park) will have a proposition on the ballot that combines two of our existing millages.

Is this a new tax? NO, this is NOT a new tax. This is a combination and replacement of two existing special tax levies that voters have already passed. The existing special tax levies of 2.78 mils (passed in 2007) and 3.27 mils (passed in 2014) would be combined into one levy of 6.05 mils.

What is the benefit of combining them now? This would greatly benefit Recreation District #1 by providing new financing opportunities for our planned capital projects. The current structure of our millages limits our ability to issue new debt to pay for our planned capital projects. The proposed combined tax levy would permit us to issue a sufficient amount of debt to fund our intended capital improvements and continue improving and expanding our level of services to the community. This proposition would give the District the ability to see the taxes in 2024 and have the money to actually spend for the Master Planning Projects in 2025.

How will this proposition benefit you? Pelican Park will continue to provide excellent recreation for the community as well as the new opportunities identified in our Master Plan. There is something for everyone at Pelican Park!

Skate Park and Pump Track Expansion Update

Recreation District #1 is excited to have one of our priority projects identified in the master plan well on its way! The Park has contracted with Newline Skateparks, Inc., a full-service planning, design and construction firm specializing in the development of integrated concrete skateparks, pump tracks and other progressive action sports environments. Newline's

team consists of registered landscape architects, engineering experts and construction professionals who are passionate, active skateboarders.

With operations spanning over 20 years and nearly 400 highly recognized projects across North America, Europe, Australia, and Asia, Newline is considered one of the world's longest running and most respected municipal skatepark, and pump track design-build firms.

Two Community Engagement meetings were held to gather input for design, the first on September 19th and the second on October 25th. Community Engagement also included a survey accessible through a QR code that was posted for two weeks following each community meeting. We had approximately 40 attendees at both meetings and an additional 50+ responses from each survey. This meeting included an in-person design charette where a group activity was performed by five groups of eight or more where participants selected desired terrain and located them to scale on the project site. Finally, a spokesperson from each group described the priorities of the group input.

At the 2nd Community Engagement meeting, Newline presented conceptual drawings and received lots of feedback from the public. Three concept drawings were presented and attendees identified what they liked about each one. The final design will incorporate elements from the 3 conceptual designs presented.

Additionally, the community's feedback highlighted a strong desire for a skatepark that reflects local culture and uniqueness. Incorporating elements like pelican-themed art or features, and possibly using colors or motifs that resonate with the local community, could add a distinct touch. Artistic representations of local landmarks or cultural symbols in the skatepark's design would enhance its appeal and identity

A Behind-the-Scenes Look at Pelican Park

Our Turf Management

In this edition of a Behind- the Scenes Look, we take you on a journey to explore the meticulous care and attention our Turf Staff dedicates to maintain the lush, green playing fields that provide the backdrop for countless memories, competition and learning.

A Symphony of Precision and Timing

Design Direction 1

Imagine mowing over 2,178,000 square feet of Hybrid Tifway 419 Bermuda grass. That's the impressive feat accomplished by only 4 of our amazing Pelican Park Turf Professionals. The fields, spanning

50 acres, are a testament to their commitment and to think, as soon as they reach the end, our staff starts the process again since they are usually mowed twice a week to ensure a consistent and pristine playing surface.

The Science of Fertilization

Maintaining the integrity of our turfs requires a carefully crafted regimen. Every 6 to 8 weeks, the park undergoes a transformation with the application of 15,000 lbs. of fertilizer. This nourishment ensures the turf remains resilient and lush throughout the year. Additionally, our diligent staff aerates all fields every 8 weeks. This crucial process reduces footprints, alleviates soil compaction, and facilitates the percolation of air and water, creating an optimal environment for healthy turf growth.

Fields are meticulously maintained at a height of 1¹/₄" during the spring and summer, a decision informed by soil testing analysis. This method allows our Turf Staff to tailor their approach, providing the necessary nutrients for the soil to thrive in every season.

Watering Wisdom for Drought-Resilient Fields

Water is the elixir of life, and our fields receive a carefully calibrated dose through our irrigation system. Equipped with 693 Falcon Rainbird heads, our game fields boast a watering infrastructure. During the drier months, from June to September,

these heads disperse over 1.5 million gallons of water per week, ensuring our turf remains vibrant and resilient even in the face of drought conditions like we have been experiencing for the past few months.

As we celebrate the beauty of our playing fields, let's also extend our gratitude to the Turf Staff Professionals whose passion and expertise transform our beautiful Park into a haven for sports and recreation. Their dedication ensures that every game played on our fields is on a canvas with a beautiful green backdrop.

6 Electric Vehicle Charging Stations at Pelican Park!

Pelican Park is electrified!!! With EV chargers, that is! Cleco Power, Adopt a Charger and the Northshore Community Foundation are teaming up to install 40 level 2 electric vehicle charging stations at 10 sites across St. Tammany Parish

Kitty Adams, executive director for Adopt a Charger, a nonprofit organization focused on accelerating the use of plugin EVs by installing public charging stations, contacted Recreation District #1 and asked if we were interested in being a recipient of some of these chargers. According to the District's Board President, Nixon Adams, "The goal is to go beyond charging cars and educate the public on the benefits of driving electric. When people spot an EV on the road, they don't automatically notice that the vehicle runs off electricity. The 'aha' moment happens when they see the car plugged in at places they like to go. From there, they can talk to EV owners and ask about their experience."

Adopt a Charger has installed six charging stations at Pelican Park. Each station consists of two chargers, fitted with both Tesla and J-Plug so all electric vehicles can use the chargers. They are located in the parking lots; near the Castine Center, on the east side of the White Gym and in the dog park/skatepark parking lot and charging is free to the public, for at least the first three years. Pelican Park is excited to be part of this endeavor and we hope that all of you who have EVs will use these chargers which will add 10-30 miles of driving range per hour of charging.





Cool Shades

Amid Hurricane Ida in 2021, Pelican Park experienced a series of small tornadoes that tore through its grounds, causing extensive damage to numerous trees and mangling the bleachers at the Gold complex. During the restoration process, staff decided to seize the opportunity to enhance the facilities by introducing new covered shade structures to the replaced bleachers. As a result, football spectators can now enjoy the game from the upgraded bleachers, which boast comfortable backs and provide relief from the scorching heat with the added benefit of shading.

Life Just Got a Little Easier

In a move aimed at improving accessibility, the Castine Center has recently introduced a state-of-the-art automatic door system. This new installation is designed to provide greater ease for individuals requiring assistance when entering or leaving the premises. Notably, the automatic door is equipped with clearly marked indoor and outdoor access buttons, ensuring seamless and convenient access for all. The introduction of this feature is set to significantly enhance the overall accessibility of the building, making entry and exit more convenient for everyone. Accompanying this update is a snapshot of the automatic handicap door, symbolizing the center's commitment to inclusivity and improved convenience for its visitors.





On April 27, 2024 St. Tammany Parish will hold an election, and Recreation District #1 (Pelican Park) will have a proposition on the ballot that combines two of our existing millages.

Is this a new tax? NO, this is NOT a new tax. This is a combination and replacement of two existing special tax levies that voters have already passed. The existing special tax levies of 2.78 mils (passed in 2007) and 3.27 mils (passed in 2014) would be combined into one levy of 6.05 mils.

What is the benefit of combining them now? This would greatly benefit Recreation District #1 by providing new financing opportunities for our planned capital projects. The current structure of our millages limits our ability to issue new debt to pay for our planned capital projects. The proposed combined tax levy would permit us to issue a sufficient amount of debt to fund our intended capital improvements and continue improving and expanding our level of services to the community. This proposition would give the District the ability to see the taxes in 2024 and have the money to actually spend for the Master Planning Projects in 2025.

How will this proposition benefit you? Pelican Park will continue to provide excellent recreation for the community as well as the new opportunities identified in our Master Plan. There is something for everyone at Pelican Park!
