SAFETY MEASURES FOR OUR COMMUNITY



It goes by the name CASPR – Continuous Air & Surface Pathogen Reduction – and it kills 99.96 percent of all pathogens that live on surfaces and in the air. Last month nearly 30,000 square feet of the Castine Center was upgraded to include this equipment in the existing ducts of the HVAC system. How does it work? CASPR converts oxygen and moisture into hydrogen peroxide, which is then released into the air to attack any pathogens present. The level of hydrogen peroxide is not harmful, but is enough to make the Castine Center safer and is helpful in the fight against COVID-19, mold, odors, bacteria and more. It's not a new science, but it has been proven in hospitals, food processing plants and airports. Six units were installed in key areas around the Center at a cost of \$15,450. The District is awaiting more CASPR units to have installed at both the White and Brown Pelican Gymnasiums.

SPRING TIME MEANS NEW LIFE AT THE PARK



SAVE THE TURTLES

This Momma river cooter turtle found a nice shady spot to lay her eggs before running off to cool down in the water once her job was done. Her eggs are approximately 1.5 inches (4 cm) long. The egg incubation time is determined by temperature, but averages 90-100 days. These hatchlings should emerge this August or September. Please be careful around the marked areas as to not disturb the eggs so they can hatch and find new homes.



KILLDEER NESTS

The killdeer bird will usually line their nest with vegetation and white material, such as pebbles, rocks or seashell fragments. Two killdeer Momma birds decided our parking lots were a perfect place to lay their eggs. Thanks to our park crew for spotting these nests so we can mark them and keep them safe. Please make sure to always be careful around their nests...Momma bird is very protective and will charge you if you come close to her eggs. It is a very vocal bird and sometimes calls out, "kil-deee" (the basis of its common name).



FROGS AND TOADS

Southern Leopard frogs are very common in our area. These frogs can be green or brown in color with a yellowish ridge along each side of the back. The female lays 1,500 plus eggs which when all together, can be about the size of a baseball, when close to hatching. Southern Leopard Frogs eat insects, crawfish and other invertebrates.

PARK UPDATES

While areas of the Park were closed during the quarantine, such as the gyms and playground areas, we stayed busy by completing some of our planned funded construction projects. Take a look at the pictures below to see all of our progress. The Brown Pelican Gym ceiling, flooring, and parking lot were all replaced. The Blue and Green playground, as well as The Groves exercise equipment, have a new poured in place safety surface.

WE PLANTED TEN NEW OAK TREES



We planted 10 beautiful new Quercus Virginiana trees around the Park, also known as the Southern Live Oak Tree

UPDATED THE BROWN GYM CEILING & FLOOR



Beier Construction replaced the Brown Gym ceiling and added 8 inches of insulation and covered it with wire to protect it from sports balls.

Covington Flooring came in and grounded down the old top surface and repainted and apoxied the gym floor.

POURED 2 BRAND NEW PARKING LOTS



Barriere Construction added 2 brand new parking lots to our Park. One has 3 handicapped parking spaces by The Groves and the other one has 21 new parking spaces behind the Brown Pelican Gym. Spookie Striping came in and painted all of the parking spaces.

REPLACED 2 PARKING LOT SURFACES



Barriere Construction also resurfaced 2 parking lots including the lot behind the Castine Center and the Brown Pelican Gym

POURED NEW SAFETY SURFACES



Quality Flooring resurfaced some of the old tile playground surfaces and installed a new poured in place safety surface under our playgrounds and The Groves adult exercise equipment.

OUR 2 DOG PARKS

Did you know that we have 2 dog parks for our community to enjoy? Pretty Acres Dog Park is on Andrew Drive off of Hwy 190 in Covington and our Bark Park is at Pelican Park. The Bark Park is 4 acres and has 2 separated areas, one for small dogs and one for large dogs. We have agility equipment, pools, covered pavilions to sit in the shade and a wash-off station to use when needed. Our dog parks are a great place to make new friends and plan a few doggie playdates together.



DISC GOLF

Disc Golf is a great sport for all ages! It's very similar to golf, but you throw a disc instead of hitting a ball. Players complete a hole by throwing a disc from a tee area toward a target which is called the basket. The player with the lowest number of total throws at the end of the round wins. Come out and throw a round with your family and see why it's so relaxing and fun. It's a great way to get those extra steps in, too.



SKATE PARK

The Pelican's Nest Skate Park is located at the north end of Pelican Park and is recommended for all ages and abilities. Lights are provided for night riding as well.
DAILY HOURS: 7am-9pm
Bikes are permitted at the skate park during the following times:
• Tues & Thur, 7-9 p.m.
• Sat- 7-9 a.m.
During these times, the skate park is for bikes only (no skateboards or scooters). Helmets, knee pads and elbow pads are strongly encouraged.



PICKLEBALL

Pickleball is still one of the fastest growing sports in America. It's great for families, friends and people of all ages! It's like table tennis meets traditional tennis. You have a net, a small court, paddles, and a lightweight ball (similar to a whiffle ball). Players can play singles or doubles. Come by and try it out with your friends and family.

We have 8 outdoor pickleball courts at The Groves. Please make sure to sanitize your hands and equipment frequently and make sure to bring your own pickleball equipment. During this time, we are not loaning out shared equipment.



ADULT EXERCISE

Take a beautiful walk around The Groves and stop by the adult exercise equipment on each lap and work on a core muscle group or get some extra cardio in. We have 9 outside exercise stations that are ready for you to come workout with your friends or enjoy a quiet outdoor setting. Each piece of equipment has been specifically designed to strengthen and promote health and well being through individual adjustment settings. Pelican Park invites you to test our full body workout stations. Please make sure to sanitize your hands and equipment before and after use.

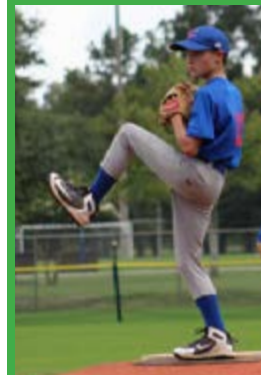

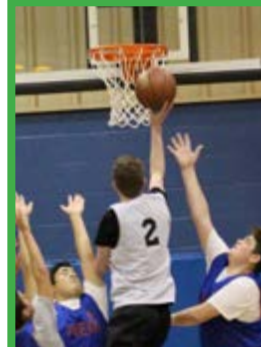

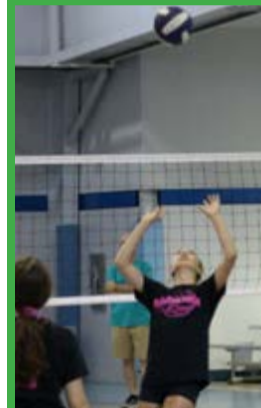
Since the Summer league did not happen for the older boys due to Covid-19, we would like to offer a short Fall season to give the boys a chance to get out and play basketball.

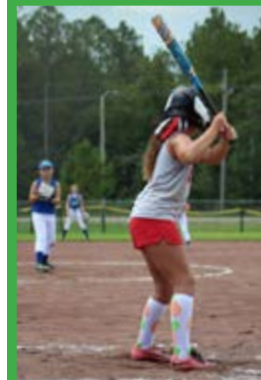
The objective of the Pelican Park volleyball program is to provide players with the fundamentals of volleyball, teach teamwork, and build character.

WE ARE SO EXCITED TO HAVE BASEBALL AND SOFTBALL COACHES AND PLAYERS BACK ON THE FIELDS!



The Recreation Department is excited to announce that the boys and girls that registered for Baseball / Softball Season back in March are about to finish up their "Spring" season. It was very exciting to see the kids enjoy the fields and the Park again. The Recreation Department completed in one week what would normally take two weeks to complete to get the kids back on the field. We had our challenges with the weather, but we got it done for our players and families and they have had a blast.



We have a total of 855 players registered and playing softball / baseball (597 boys/ 257 girls). While our numbers are down for boys and girls, we are excited they were able to have their season. The majority of the refund requests we have been getting are due to vacations and other activities that will interfere. Very few have been from the fear of COVID-19.

This year due to COVID-19, we were not able to give the coaches a set of catcher's gear or batting helmets to share. Instead we had an average of 3-4 sets per team (73 teams) available for games and practices. With us playing in the hottest part of the year we anticipate a large rotation of catchers during the games due to heat. This came to approximately 219 - 292 sets that we would need. So, the Pelican Park Rec Department ordered \$20-\$25K worth of catcher gear that are now bagged and sanitized on a daily basis as they are used. To make sure we are giving our patrons and players a safe playing environment we have spent a lot of time and effort on sanitizing this equipment, setting up sanitizing stations as you come in each facility so everyone can use them as they enter and leave the fields and gyms. We also have disinfectant sprays in the dugouts for coaches and players to use when needed and we strongly encourage the use of masks and social distancing for all spectators, coaches and players during the games.



Virtual Programs Became a Reality!

While many things have changed following the Covid-19 Pandemic, some have remained the same with new additional features. Pelican Park initially halted its leisure programs when news of the Corona virus broke, back in March 2020, for the safety of our patrons. When the Governor announced that Louisiana would be moving forward with re-opening phases starting in May, Pelican Park Staff jumped into action, coming up with a creative plan to once again offer leisure program classes in the safest way possible.

Accepting the challenge, staff determined that in-person classes would not be in the best interest of our higher-risk participants. Instead, staff opted to take the virtual approach, setting up classes via Zoom, Facebook Video, and more. Participants were instructed to register for June programs as normal and anticipate a pre-determined "supply-kit" pick-up date with an emailed virtual link. Patrons would be allowed to drive-thru on the designated day and time to pick-up their needed supplies for scheduled classes later in the week. On the scheduled class date, participants could then follow the link and participate in a live virtual class in the comfort of their own home.



Needless to say, virtual programs were a hit, with some participants calling to thank us for moving forward with offering these classes. Many participants enjoyed having the convenience of easy registration and drive-thru supply pick-up, all while maintaining enjoyable activities and socialization from a distance.

In this uncertain time, Pelican Park is happy to provide a small dose of normalcy through the outlet of virtual classes. While a great solution, we certainly looked forward to offering our in-person classes again as we moved into the next phase. We've enjoyed having our participants within our facilities, and seeing familiar faces back in our classrooms. Our staff has taken every precaution to clean and sanitize our facilities for the safety of our patrons. 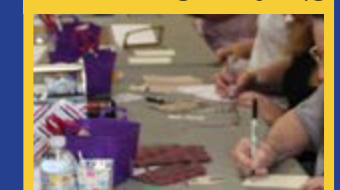

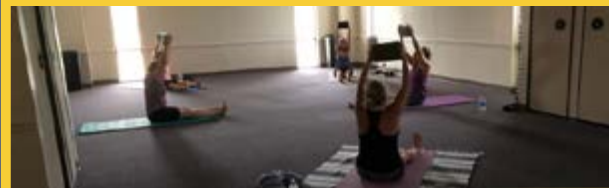

Pelican Play-up Policy

The Park no longer allows play-ups for leagues with combined age groups. This change is to keep with the philosophy that was set years ago by the Board of Commissioners that restricts three age groups, with the exception of high school age players, from playing together in the same league. The philosophy was established for player safety and development. This means that parents will not have the option to play their child up if the age group they are moving into already has two ages combined. (Example, a 10-year-old player could not move into the 11-12 age groups.) Play-ups to single age groups will remain a parent's choice.

Debit/Credit Card Information

Please note that when using a debit or credit card for youth sports registration, your card will be pre-authorized and your bank may place a hold on your account for the registration amount for 72 hours or longer for each registration you attempt. The Park has no control over how long your bank places a hold on the funds.

Refund Policy

Until team formation, refunds are given upon request less a \$5 handling fee. Between the draft and the second game, a refund request is not guaranteed. However, a refund will be issued during this time if a child from the waiting list accepts the open spot. When the waiting list child has registered, we will issue a refund to the child dropping from the league less the \$5 handling fee when the uniform, if already issued, is returned. After the second game of the season is played, we do not issue refunds for ANY reason.

Scholarships Available

The Park believes that all District children should be able to play sports regardless of their ability to pay. Should you need financial assistance with youth sports registration, please come in to our office and complete an application. Scholarships are available to District residents only and you must come in to our office to apply.

Secondary Medical Insurance

As part of your registration fee, Pelican Park purchases secondary insurance for your child for injuries sustained while playing in our programs.
