Full-Time Positions

Full time positions include Excellent Benefits!

Park Assistant Superintendent

Salary: \$46,040.87 - \$63,773.11

This is normally a full-time, 40 hour / week position that includes rotational Manager on Call shifts. Job will require employee to work overtime during scheduled tournaments and/or if required for emergency repairs. It requires the employee to have the ability to handle all the listed duties and responsibilities and possess experience/knowledge required for this position. It also requires the listed physical abilities.

Labor Maintenance

Starting Salary: \$15.00 per hour

Recreation District #1 / Pelican Park, which is a public agency, is seeking to fill openings for Labor Maintenance. This position offers 40 hrs. per week and does involve some overtime and weekend work. This position offers great benefits such as paid health / dental insurance, retirement, vacation and sick leave. The starting salary is \$12.70 per hour. This is an outdoor position that does include working in all weather conditions, such as rain, snow and heat.

Part-Time Positions

Pelican Park Facility Staff

Starting Salary: \$15.00/hour

This staff works in the park in the evenings and on weekends preparing for practices and games, turning on lights, attending to restrooms, some field set up, meeting the public, answering questions and problem-solving. This position works outside the majority of the time and requires the ability to be able to lift 50lbs. Communicates with other staff and management on a two-way radio and takes public calls via phone. It also requires the ability to communicate in written form. Flexible hours.

Castine Center Event Staff

Starting Salary: \$15.00/hour

The staff works in the Castine Center to maintain all areas of the facility in "show condition" at all times including before, during and after events. Duties include but are not limited to cleaning

restrooms, removing trash from all areas of the building, cleaning and setting up tables and/or chairs, vacuuming, mopping and cleaning interior/exterior windows. Position requires the ability to lift 50lbs, communicate with other staff and management via two-way radio and communicate verbally with rental groups. This is a part-time position with the majority of scheduled hours on evenings and/or weekends.

Concessions Staff

Starting Salary: \$10.00/hour

Concession Staff workers are responsible for selling concessions to spectators at a variety of sports and local events. Welcoming guests at the concession stand, taking orders for food or beverage, presenting prices, and options, processing cash payments, operating food preparation equipment, and maintaining the concession area so it is clean and sanitized.

Castine Center Renovations In Full Swing!

Many of you have had the opportunity to see a lot of the upgrades and renovations to the inside of the Castine Center. There's still more to do, but it's really shaping up. The project, with a low bid of \$2.7 million, was awarded in late 2021 and is expected to be complete by the end of the year.

Construction has progressed to the outside of the building where the foundation and framing for the new office expansion has begun as well as the foundation for the highly anticipated courtyard for outdoor events. An additional storage area is being built on the West side of the building to house more equipment for special events.

When complete, the concourse will boast skylights and a water feature. Out front will also be renovated with a fountain and a gorgeous pelican water feature, benches, landscaping and upgraded lighting.

Our 2 Dog Parks


A great way to socialize and meet new dog lovers is to come out to our dog parks! Our Pelican Park Bark Park has 2 fenced in exercise areas, one for small dogs and one for large dogs. Both areas have gazebos, benches, pools, water fountains for dogs and patrons and plenty of green space for your dogs to play. There is a dog washing station outside of the fences for everyone's use and the larger dog area has agility equipment for the dogs to play in and on as well. Parking for the Bark Park is located across the street next to the Pelican's Nest Skate Park. Recreation District #1 also has an additional dog park located in Covington. It's called Pretty Acres Dog Park, located on Andrew Drive, off of Hwy 190 in Covington. Pretty Acres is a one-acre green space for you and your furry family member to enjoy.

Please make sure **TO READ ALL** of the posted rules before entering the dog parks. Owners are responsible for their dogs behavior.

Disc Golf

Do you want to get your steps in for the day, have some friendly competition and enjoy a walk through the park? Disc Golf is a perfect way for family or friends of all ages to enjoy some outdoor fun and friendly competition together. The sport is played using discs (frisbees®) and is similar to golf, however one throws a disc instead of hitting a ball. Players complete a hole by throwing a disc from the tee area toward a target which is called the basket. The player with the lowest number of total throws at the last hole wins. Skate Park

The Pelican's Nest Skate Park is located at the north end of Pelican Park and is recommended for all ages and abilities. Lights are provided for night riding as well.

DAILY HOURS: 7 a.m. - 9 p.m.

Bikes are permitted at the skate park during the following times:

- Tuesday & Thursday from 5 7 p.m.
- Saturday from 7 9 a.m.

During these times, the skate park is for bikes only (no skateboards or scooters). Helmets, knee pads and elbow pads are strongly encouraged.



Pickleball

In 2019, Pelican Park built an outdoor Pickleball facility with eight pickleball courts. They were the first of their kind built in St. Tammany Parish. Open Play is available on a firstcome, first-served basis, seven days a week, excluding the times scheduled for park programming, facility rentals, and tournaments. The courts are lit for evening play hours and it's a perfect way to let off steam, have some friendly competition and/or end your day. It's also a perfect game for all ages young and old, so gather your family, friends and coworkers and come join our pickleball community and the Pelican Park Pickleball Facility.



Adult Exercise Equipment

The Groves has added a shade structure over our 9 outdoor fitness machines made by Greenfield Exercise Equipment. The equipment consists of machines that develop stamina, arms and upper body, legs and lower body as well as overall conditioning. The machines use your body weight for resistance. The Groves is a great place to get a workout in while the kids are at practice. Combine the equipment circuit training with our walking trail for a great overall workout! Please make sure to sanitize your hands and equipment before and after use - sanitizing stations are provided at every complex in the Park.

Recreation District #1 has partnered with Mandeville Soccer Club (MSC) to provide this community with one of the best soccer programs in the South. The District provides the fields, painting of the game lines, goals and turf care and MSC handles all aspects of the administration of the soccer programs which includes registration, team formation, coaches and schedules.

Debit/Credit Card Information

Please note that when using a debit or credit card for youth sports registration, your card will be pre-authorized and your bank may place a hold on your account for the registration amounts for 72 hours or longer for each registration you attempt.

Refund Policy

Until team formation, refunds are given upon request less a \$5 handling fee. Between the draft and the second game, a refund request is not guaranteed. However, a refund will be issued during this time if a child from the waiting list accepts the open spot. When the waiting list child has registered, we will issue a refund to the child dropping from the league less the \$5 handling fee when the uniform, if already issued, is returned. After the second game of the season is played, we do not issue refunds for ANY reason.

Scholarships Available

Should you need financial assistance with youth sports registration, please come in to our office and complete an application. Scholarships are available to District residents only and you must come in to our office to apply.

General Registration and New Player Information

Office Registration Hours - Mon-Fri 8:00am-5:00pm

First time players can create an account online, or bring a copy of their birth certificate to the office.

If you are interested in playing your child up, please contact the office immediately and request the proper paperwork. Due to limited registration, play-ups are not guaranteed and will only be granted in the order they are received. Unlike regular season basketball, determination will not be made until after registration has ended and only if openings are available in that age group.





Why Nature-based?

Science has proven that an increase in "screen time" and lack of time spent outdoors has an adverse effect on children. Contact with nature awakens our senses. Consider the smell of an ocean breeze or the sweet scent of a freshly mown hay field. Close your eyes and listen to the story a songbird sings to greet the day and the soothing hoot of an owl putting the day to rest. Taste a sun-warmed blueberry or the single droplet of sweetness inside the flower of the honeysuckle bush. Touch the smooth back of a frog or the soft fur of a rabbit.

By allowing children to explore and spend time with nature, we can foster and renew this connection with the natural world, which has been lost to classrooms and technology. *Louv (2008) states that "Natural play strengthens children's self-confidence and arouses their senses" (p. 186). *Louv,R. The Purple Martin



What is a Purple Martin?

- Purple Martins (Progne subis) are native songbirds in the swallow family. They are the largest swallow in the family and the only martin in North America.
- The adult male is the only Purple Martin to have the iridescent purple feathers covering the entire body. Female Purple Martins are duller in color with gray on their head and chest, and a lighter lower belly.
- Purple Martins are aerial insectivores, eating only flying insects. They eat large insects such as dragonflies, butterflies, moths, bees and wasps. Martins are fast fliers, foraging for food during the day, high in the sky.
- Purple Martins are cavity nesters, building nests in hollowed out locations. Nests are shallow, constructed of thin twigs and straw and lined with green leaves. On average, martins lay 5-7 white eggs that hatch 16 days after the last egg is laid.

Where are Purple Martins?

Purple Martins are long distant, neotropical migratory birds. They spend the breeding months in North America, where they lay eggs, raise young, and prepare for migration. During non-breeding months, the birds can be found in South America, feeding over the tropical rainforest, rivers and farmland of Brazil.

- In eastern North America during the summer, look for Purple Martins around man-made martin houses that many people put up in yards. In the West, you will find them nesting in natural cavities of trees and cactus.
- Foraging Purple Martins hunt insects higher in the air than other swallows, but in the afternoon and evening they may feed low and close to nest sites. In late summer you might see enormous roosts of Purple Martins, particularly in the Southeast as they prepare to migrate to South America.

Why are Purple Martins important?

- Purple Martins are secondary cavity nesters. They nest in a cavity, but do not excavate the cavity themselves. Instead, they use old woodpecker cavities, or natural cavities in dead trees, cliff faces or cactus.
- In the eastern half of North America, Purple Martins have undergone what is known as a tradition shift. Gradually, they have switched from using natural cavities to artificial housing humans supply for them. Native Americans started this tradition shift hundreds or even thousands of years ago, by putting up dried, hollowedout gourds for the martins.
- Today in the eastern half of North America, martins are completely dependent on supplied housing for breeding. They now nest only in gourds and multicompartment wood and metal housing. This bond created between us and bird cannot be undone and without the continued support from people, purple martin housing will decline and along with it, the populations of these graceful, insect eating companions.
