










Pelican Park Updates



The Pines Disc Golf Course at Pelican Park

Tucked in between athletic fields and the scenic natural areas of Pelican Park, The Pines Disc Golf Course has been a staple for local disc golf enthusiasts since it was first established in 2013. Designed by Josh Edwards and Mike Kernan, the course was thoughtfully laid out to blend the natural landscape with fun and challenging play for all skill levels.

Now, more than a decade later, The Pines is entering an exciting new chapter with major upgrades designed to enhance the player experience and establish the course as a premier disc golf destination on the Northshore. A huge thank you to Skip Skarin and Thurston Yates for leading the charge and putting in extra effort to improve the flow of the course and install top-of-theline MVP baskets. We also want to thank them for updating the locations on the Udisc app. You can now scan the QR code at Hole 1 to be guided through the course, and even keep score right in the app!

Among the most notable enhancements is the installation of two sets of permanent baskets on every hole, giving players the option to play a long or short layout on each hole. This dual-basket setup provides flexibility for casual games, competitive rounds, and skill development alike.

In addition to the upgraded baskets, the course has been reconfigured to improve overall game flow, making navigation between holes more intuitive and enjoyable. New and improved signage has been installed throughout the course to help players more easily navigate from hole to hole or shall we say basket to basket.

These enhancements reflect Pelican Park's continued commitment to offering diverse, high-quality recreational opportunities for our community. Whether you're an experienced disc golfer or trying the sport for the first time, The Pines now offers an exciting, refreshed experience surrounded by the natural beauty of the park.

New Weather Safety System at Pelican Park!

We're excited to announce that three weather stations have been installed at Pelican Park, powered by Perry Weather!

These on-site weather stations provide real-time lightning detection and send automatic safety alerts within 15 seconds, helping keep everyone safe during outdoor activities.

Here's what to expect at Pelican Park:

- Loud Alerts: Alarms will sound, and strobes will display if lightning is within 10 miles.
- With the Perry Weather Widget at PelicanPark.com you will have:
- Real-Time Weather Updates and Forecasts for: Rain, Temperature, Lightning and Wind Conditions.
- See countdown timers after lightning, alert to know when it is safe to resume play.
- NOTE: Live lightning timers reset with every new strike...no guessing needed! Our staff actively monitors the Pelican Park App to help keep you informed and safe.

Whether you're a Bark Park regular, pickleball fanatic or gearing up for a round of disc golf, make sure the weather's right before you and your family before you drive over... you can now go to our website to check the rain, wind direction and strength before driving to the park.

Pelican Park features two on-site dog parks...one for larger breeds and another for small dogs...that are tucked away near the back of the 500 acres for a peaceful retreat. 



PARENT, PLAYER, COACH EJECTIONS

Pelican Park maintains a zero-tolerance policy for violations of the Player, Parent, or Coach Code of Conduct. REFUND POLICY

Until team formation, refunds are given upon request less a \$5 handling fee. Between the draft and the second game, a refund request is not guaranteed. Pelican Park Nature Club

Birdwatchers have what's referred to as a "Spark Bird"—the bird that sparked their lifelong interest in birdwatching. Maybe we held a quiet admiration for the hardy House Sparrows in Home Depot's Garden Center as a child, or we catch ourselves looking for the pair of Red-Shouldered Hawks that call Asbury Drive home as we drive down that stretch of Highway 190.

I believe the Spark Bird phenomenon extends to the natural world at large. Maybe our Spark Bird is a unique plant, a peculiar mushroom, or a neat bug; I believe everybody has a Spark Something that serves as a catalyst to a lifelong interest in the outdoors. Our Spark Something often finds us, but sometimes we need a little help.



That's where the Pelican Park Nature Club comes in! Our programs and events cover an array of topics and interests. Since our first event on April 26th, a Full Moon Night Hike, we've had in-the-field learning about birdwatching, edible plants, citizen science projects, butterflies and insects, native mushrooms, native medicinal herbs, urban nature walks with the Wednesday Run Club, and paddles down Cane Bayou with Canoe and Trail Adventures!


Here are three repeat programs to add to your calendar:

- Join us for a bird walk around Fontainebleau State Park! All experience levels welcome, especially newcomers. We will meet near the splashpad area at 8:00. We expect the walk to last around 2 hours. Binoculars provided thanks to our friends at Sport Optics. There is a \$3 entrance fee into the state park.





Other July Programs:

- 7/12 @ 10AM LSU Raptor Rehab at Pelican Park, White Pelican Gym #3.
- Get ready for an incredible opportunity as we host the LSU Raptor Rehabilitation Program! This is your chance to see raptors up close and learn about the vital work LSU does in conservation, research, and education.
- 7/15 @ 8:30AM Field trip to Southeastern University's Turtle Cove Environmental Research Station
- Southeastern Louisiana University's Turtle Cove Environmental Research Station offers unique field research and educational experiences within the Lake Pontchartrain estuary. Its diverse wetland environments, ranging from fresh to saline, and existing in various states of preservation, provide excellent opportunities for comparative study.
- Turtle Cove hosts educational field trips for K-12 students, university groups, and community organizations, covering wetland science, environmental history, and coastal wetland loss. Field trips include:
 - A lecture on wetlands and environmental issues.
 - A pontoon boat ride to the station.
 - A guided boardwalk tour with plant identification, dip netting, and water quality sampling.

Participants will learn about wetlands ecology, restoration, and adaptations, while observing local wildlife and plants.

- Discover the hidden world that awakens after sunset. In this photographic presentation, Bill Wimley showcases how an illuminated white sheet can attract a stunning array of moths, beetles, and other nocturnal insects—offering a rare glimpse into the rich biodiversity that comes alive after dark.
- 7/26 @ 7:30PM Creatures of the Night field trip, Northlake Nature Center.
- Companion field trip to Bill Wimley's 7/23 presentation. We will observe a moth sheet and all the fun creatures it draws out after the sun sets!

Species Spotlight Prothonotary Warbler

After spending winter in South America, you can rely on the Prothonotary warbler to arrive in South Louisiana around the first day of Spring. They love the abundance of wet, swampy areas in Louisiana; John Audubon even noted that "Louisiana seems in fact better suited to its habits than any other state". Their name comes from bright yellow robes that papal clerks (called Prothonotaries) wore in the Catholic Church. They forage low in search for insects and small mollusks. They can be found near virtually any body of water in Louisiana from late March until October. Listen for their distinct "sweet-sweet-sweet" call on your next nature hike!

At Pelican Park, we're not just admirers of this native beauty; we're active participants in its preservation through a vital partnership with the Louisiana Iris Conservation Initiative (LICI).

LICI's mission is dedicated to the rescue and planting of wild, native irises facing habitat destruction. Pelican Park proudly supports this endeavor, contributing to the recovery of these threatened wildflowers.

This incredible work would not be possible without the tireless efforts and unwavering passion of Gary Salathe, LICI's visionary founder and dedicated organizer. His commitment to conserving Louisiana's native irises is truly inspiring, and we are deeply grateful for his leadership and collaboration.

Over the past winter, a series of dedicated volunteer planting events, meticulously organized by LICI, allowed us to significantly expand our iris bog. Thanks to the hard work of volunteers and LICI's guidance, we successfully added over 1,000 irises to our collection. This tremendous effort culminated in a spectacular blooming event this March and April, transforming our bog into a vibrant tapestry of color and showcasing the stunning results of our conservation work. Native Beauty in the Castine Center Parking Lot

We're excited to announce that the Castine Center parking lot now features beautiful native plants! A Huge thanks to John Broderick for sparking this idea and connecting us with Jess Cole of Sweet Fern Landscapes to bring this vision to life.

Our newly designed parking areas are now vibrant with a simple yet elegant mix of native plants, adding bursts of color, interesting textures, and graceful movement. By choosing all-native plantings, our parking islands have become rich, perennial habitats for pollinators, providing significant ecological benefits to our local environment. Plus, you'll appreciate the hardy, mostly evergreen foliage that keeps things beautiful year-

Included are groups of Sweet Bay Magnolias adding their charm. In the summertime, a delightful citrus scent will waft from their blooms, while their silvery-green foliage provides an elegant evergreen canopy throughout

For a unique visual experience, some islands are now graced with a mass planting of Muhly grass. This "sea of grass" sways gracefully in the wind, offering a soft texture and a beautiful fluorescence in the cooler seasons.

Other areas showcase an alternating pattern of Dwarf Palmetto and American Beautyberry. These two native gems provide wonderful textural contrasts and create captivating focal points.

Finally, bright pops of color draw your eye with showy perennials like Large and Orange Coneflower, Inland Sea Oats, and Gulf Penstemon. These vibrant additions add an extra touch of cheer to the center.

We invite you to take a moment to appreciate this beautiful and beneficial new addition to the Castine Center. It's more than just landscaping; it's an investment in our local ecosystem and a testament to our commitment to creating a more vibrant and sustainable environment for everyone.
