Please be aware of the numerous amounts of car break-ins lately throughout St Tammany Parish! These break-ins are prevalent in many public and private recreation type facilities.

Thieves target public parks, gyms, health clubs etc. where people leave their purses or other valuables locked in their car while they are exercising. We are working with St. Tammany Parish Sheriff's Office to help apprehend the thieves. Please be mindful and do your part and do not leave your valuables in your vehicle.

## SILVER PRACTICE FIELDS

The six silver practice fields at the north end of the Park are designed for first-come, first-serve usage. The three pie shape fields and the three rectangular shaped fields all have lights for evening usage. The District does rent out the silver fields on a quarterly basis to travel teams for practice. One field of each type is always left open for first-come, first-serve usage. The silver fields are perfect for pick up games, family games, flying

## **DID YOU KNOW??**

#### 

- 1. The Park has over 1 million visitations per year. On a typical Saturday there are over 10,000-15,000 people in the Park.
- 2. The District pays over \$185,000 per year for field lights, gym lights and road way lights.
- 3. The District operates and maintains all the parking lots and roads within the Park. The roads are public but maintained by Park staff. In 2017, the District spent \$475,026.00 to repair, resurface and add new traffic striping to all 2 miles of the roadway as well as 1 parking lot.
- 4. The District operates its' own sewer and water systems and must meet all DEQ requirements similar to large cities. Park staff must be certified by DEQ to work on these systems. Cost per year for maintenance, repairs, permits etc is \$31,000.00.

The dog park is free to use but users must read and follow posted rules.

## **BATTING CAGES ARE OPEN**

#### Baseball and softball seasons are over, but don't stop practicing!

Take advantage of The Cages on the off season and be ready to shine in the fall. There are nine individual stations, and the automated pitching machines are designed for everyone ages 9 and older. Tokens are \$1 for 15 swings, and you receive bonus tokens when you spend \$10 or \$20. The Cages are open Friday, 5-8 p.m.; Saturday, 10 a.m.-7 p.m.; and Sunday, noon-7 p.m.



## PELICAN'S NEST SKATE PARK

Our skate park is called The Pelican's Nest and it's located at the northern end of the Park. The park is intended for beginner and intermediate skate boarders and trick cyclist alike. It is free to the public, and the hours are 7am to 9pm daily. All users must obey the posted rules to en-

joy the amenities. The skate park has times for bike riders only (Tuesdays and Thursdays, 7-9pm; and Saturdays, 7-9am).

Lockers are available, but visitors must bring their own padlocks. The skate park also has bathrooms, vending machines and lights for night riding. Helmets, knee pads and elbow pads are strongly encouraged.

#### Pelican Park Play-Up Policy

The Park no longer allows play-ups for leagues with combined age groups. This change is to keep with the philosophy that was set years ago by the Board of Commissioners that restricts three age groups, with the exception of high school age players, from playing together in the same league. The philosophy was established for player safety and development. This means that parents will not have the option to play their child up if the age group they are moving into already has two ages combined. (Example, a 10-year-old player could not move into the 11-12 age groups.) Play-ups to single age groups will remain a parent's choice. Play-up requests to single age groups will be pending until leagues are formed.

## **ADULT SPORTS**

Pelican Park offers a variety of adult sports to serve our community. The purpose of the leagues is to provide an outlet for adults to continue playing their favorite sport, have fun, stay fit, and to socialize. Registration is done by teams only for adult sports: however, individuals may call the Park and have their name added to a list of interested players. If enough individuals call to make a team, the Park will assist them in forming a team.

## PICKLEBALL

Pickleball enthusiasts are now calling Pelican Park home since the start of open play in early May. Just recently, the Park decided to add to its open play hours to accommodate the growth and interest. Pelican Park now offers open play on Sundays from 2pm-6pm and Tuesdays from 6pm-9pm at the White Pelican Gym.

Three courts are available during open play on a first-come, first-served basis. Time limits will be imposed if others are waiting to play. Participants are asked to bring their own equipment (paddles and balls) to open play, though a limited number of paddles and balls will be available for checkout for those who are new to the sport.

As the latest addition to Park programming, Pickleball saw its début in early May and has been growing ever since. The Park is anxiously anticipating the outdoor courts construction scheduled to begin this fall. Watch for more fun to come as well as the grand opening for the outdoor pickleball courts slated for summer 2019.
